Another wonderful start to the term at JPS with a whole raft of activities getting us set for learning and finishing off a remarkable year of learning for our students. Thank you again to our parents and support staff for an incredible day at the Arabin Cup t-ball competition at Binalong in Week 2.



Being able to attend these small-school events gives our students many learning opportunities as well as developing skills in sports such as T-ball. It was a very special moment watching students from their 'sandpit volcano landscape'. In mathematics K-6 support Quandialla school, with only 14 students in their whole school, some who were unable to attend on the day, by making up their

numbers so that every game they were able to field a whole team. Our students showed responsibility and resilience during the day with an outstanding amount of respect for their teammates and opposition never failing to shake hands or congratulate their opponents on some tough games of T-ball.

This term started with a visitor to the 3-6 classroom. Miss Emily Bridgeman who many of our Gundagai preschool students remembered as Miss Emily, taking part in her 3rd year teaching practicum to

Our students (and staff) thoroughly enjoyed having Miss B share her knowledge of the Top End, learning experiences around identify and Aboriginal history and shared her enthusiasm for taking part in sports and music whilst on her prac. Whilst Miss B was here learning with the 3-6 students we had opportunities to dig deeper into our science units. including an exploding volcano experiment and developing students selfawareness of themselves

and their identity through personal development learning. Students were interested in how their adaptations of the science experiment changed the outcome including destruction of a mini-village in students also connected their science learning to landmarks and geographical terms using compass points for mapping and direction learning.


